As part of a statewide effort under **Senate Bill 1383**, California aims to reduce organic waste in landfills by 75% and recover 20% of uneaten food by the end of the year. While this initiative requires all California cities to participate, Chino Hills has been proactive in meeting these requirements in compliance with State Law. Participating in organic waste and recycling initiatives creates education and awareness about waste management and environmental conservation while also bringing together residents, businesses, and local governments to tackle the shared responsibility. This initiative is funded by CalRecycle.
